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## *Westminster Bridge Park Plaza Hotel by Digital Space*

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**Neon bright walls and art made of glass light London's Westminster Bridge Park Plaza Hotel with ever-changing colours while adding major 3D appeal.**

The hotel's focal points are the walls on either side of the main staircase, which leads from the ground floor entrance to the first floor reception area.

These walls, 12 m in length and 8 m high, gradually change colour throughout the day, pending the mood and feel of the space. To give a 3D effect, inside the walls are two huge woven meshes made from over 20000 small transparent plastic panels by **Kozio!**

Between the two glass surfaces, the meshes hang alongside a unique LED light system by **Philips** Colours Kinetics. Using 'colour graze' special lenses, the lights transmit through the mesh, creating a full RGB spectrum of colours.

'We designed these walls as semi-transparent filtering between public spaces,' explains designer Eyal Shoan of **Digital Space**. 'They are seen from the public areas and add visual interest while changing the ambiance throughout.'

Digital Space has also designed a huge glass artwork that hangs behind the reception desk. The 22 m long and 3 m high piece also fluctuates between RGB colour spectrum shades, and it has a pattern on it created through a special glass-printing technique.
